

ELECTRIC DISTRIBUTION CREW LINEMAN

The rate of pay depends on the candidate's education and/or experience, and ranges between \$14.29 to \$20.87 per hour plus full benefits.

Candidates must have some formal education from a Vocational School, or Technical College in a lineman training program, or have experience working as a lineman apprentice, as a minimum qualification. The selected candidate shall be expected to make steady progress towards attaining the position of "First Class Lineman" by demonstrating necessary knowledge, skills, and abilities. The candidate shall have three years from the date of hire to obtain this ranking, as a condition of employment.

The employee shall train under supervision in the areas of distribution/transmission, substation, high voltage line and system construction, and maintenance. Selected candidate will work initially on unenergized circuits and later work on energized circuits from lower to maximum system voltage. The work shall progress from assisted to unassisted duties.

Candidates must be available on a moments' notice for call out. Must have a valid driver's license and obtain a Commercial Driver's License. Candidates must be willing to attend formal training classes as determined by the employer. Candidates must learn to climb poles, work out of and operate a bucket truck and other relevant tools and equipment.

The selected candidate must, within 6 months of notice of employment, reside within 30 minutes driving distance to the St. Clairsville Municipal Building as a condition of employment.

The Civil Service Commission will give an eligibility test for the position. The City prefers applicants view and print application forms from the website (www.stclairsville.com) but forms can be obtained at the Office of the Director of Public Services' office, Municipal Building, 100 North Market Street, St. Clairsville, OH.

If you are a veteran, please submit a copy of your DD214 along with your application.

The deadline for submittal of the test application and \$10.00 test fee is Noon, Monday, January 23, 2012. Make checks payable to City of St. Clairsville. Application and fee can be mailed to D.O.P.S., City of St. Clairsville, P.O. Box 537, St. Clairsville, OH 43950. Applicants that show up to take the test will have the test fee refunded. Applicants that do not show up to take the test will not receive a refund.

The Civil Service Commission will administer the test on THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 9, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. in the J.B. Martin Recreation Center, 102 Fair Avenue, St. Clairsville, OH that is located at the old Belmont County Fairgrounds.

You will need to present your Photo ID on the evening of the test.
